

#### DEAR FRIENDS,

I can't be the only one who is rather grateful that Lent starts late this year - On Ash Wednesday, 5th March there will be a Communion Service in church at 10am with hymns, an address, and the traditional imposition of ashes. A retiring collection will go to Christian Aid for its work in Gaza. I hope that many of us can share in this special service that sets the tone & aim of Lent season. It also encourages us to forgo a meal and give to those for whom life seems a permanent and frightening fast. There are three Christian churches in the Gaza Strip: two in particular have provided sanctuary for Christians throughout a military campaign that has laid waste to much of the city. Their future remains precarious and our prayers should continue to embrace them.

The Church of England certainly needs its Lent. We have had a bruising and deeply distressing few months since the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury, and more recently the Bishop of Liverpool. Local churches such as ours can pray regularly and simply 'Kyrie Eleison' - Lord have mercy. We are part of a damaged institution that has lost the trust of many in its competence and integrity. Not a few have already decided that for good reasons they can no longer remain within its membership. Why then should we remain? Quite simply, the Church is more than Bishops and Synods. We, that is, all the baptised faithful of Christ in word and deed, are the Church. The Bible lays upon us the duty of not losing heart and holding fast to the truths we have received and cherish: sacraments, prayer, the necessity of service to others, the building up of fellowship, and our commitment to the person of Christ.

More details about Holy Week at All Saints will be in the April bulletin and in an Easter card that is being prepared for circulation in the parish. In the meantime please note our evening service on the 23rd, the Lent Course (back page) and consider who you might invite to our Mothering Sunday service.
